Questions by Toxic Lesbian

1. STARTING THE DEBATE WITH SUZANNE LACY

Toxic Lesbian is now working a project about female masculinities as a redefinition on patriarchy principles. Communities involved on discovering new expressions on this topic are still on social boundaries. Activism is engaged with mainstreaming these positions avoiding marginalisation pretended by patriarchy power.

Toxic Lesbian is interested on creating symbolic connections between gender identity expressions and strategic decisitions about art process.

Toxic Lesbian links Suzanne Lacy's work about "New genre of public art" at "Mapping the terrain" as an strong effort on enlarging patriarchy art boundaries. Toxic Lesbian, who is working now at the domain of gender identity not sexual orientation, places Lacy's proposal as a female masculinity version, an empowerment on mainstreaming other ways on creating art.

Toxic Lesbian is concious on Lacy's heritage on its own work. Lacy could starts their proposals as a feminist artist, Toxic Lesbian as lesbian and non hegemonic gender identity.

2. ASKING LACY ABOUT ART CONTEXT ANSWER

Lacy presented "Mapping the terrain" on 90's... twenty years ago, after two decades on feminist art creating other ways... Does she think as an excepcional witness, mainstream art has adopted their works? Is patriarchy able to change their principles? Could you talk about strategies developed by main art to avoid these new proposals? How do censorship work against women, ethnic or homosexual artists? Do you think art symbolizes strongly patriarchy social principles: author, sign (father) art recognition system –galleries, critics, art value- (mainstreaming the real father) objects creation (biological paternity)
